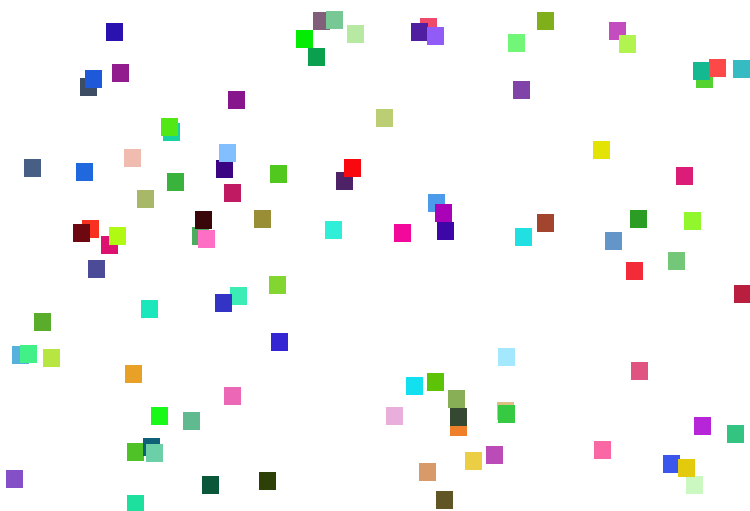




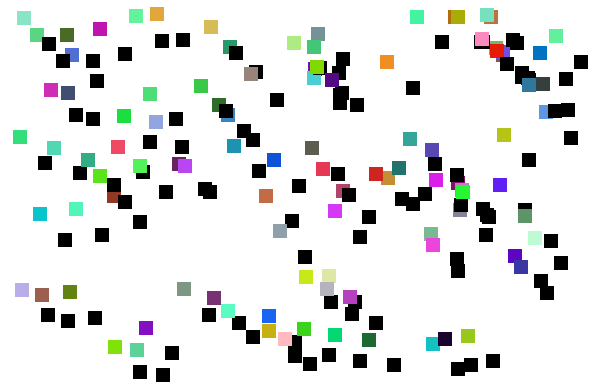
1) Select something basic, a rectangle. It could be an image or symbol or more complex shape, if required



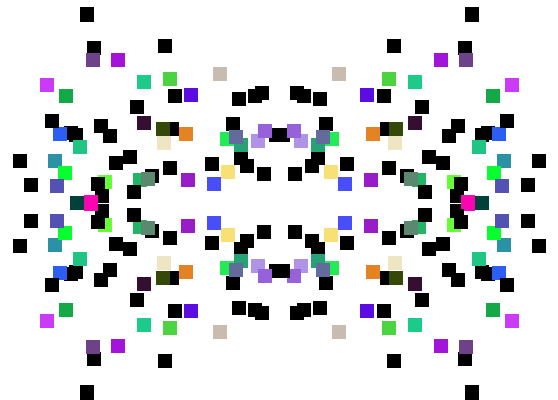
2) Select the path. By default the plug-in creates the paths throughout the document but by clicking the view limits option you can set the path's range to the current view (so zoom into a particular area of the document and create the background path here). The view option is a checkbox on the settings dialog Update the number of copies to 100



3) By default, the plug-in generates exact duplicates of the path, using the current fill and stroke. Set the fill [R] option in settings and the paths will be generated with different fills. The fill color is based on the document color model



4) If you would like to add a basic drop shadow to the paths, select the shadow option on the settings dialog A number of additional options are available such as randomizing the direction of the shadow or using the current color as the shadow or setting a different opacity



5) Click on pattern (settings dialog) and the plugin will generate a basic tiling pattern based on the original background. Note, if you started with 100 paths, and added shadow, that will be 200 paths. If you add the pattern to the mix, the paths will now number 800. If the path is fairly complex, this might be slow (say an image)
